## INTRODUCTION

In the middle of the presidential administration of Lyndon B. Johnson, his administrative chief of staff, W. Marvin Watson, became known as the "mystery man" of the White House. Watson's dedicated efforts at efficiency and cost-cutting brought press charges that he was engaged in a "gum-shoe" operation that included monitoring telephone conversations and compiling reports on automobile use among presidential staff members. Twenty years later, Watson remains one of the more obscure figures of the Johnson presidency, one who lacks the instant historical recognition accorded Walt W. Rostow, Bill Moyers, or Joseph Califano.

Yet Watson was very close to Lyndon Johnson and performed many sensitive tasks for the President. As a result, the White House files for Marvin Watson as an aide are a rich resource of material that reveals how Johnson functioned as a politician between 1965 and 1969. These documents illuminate the workings of the Democratic National Committee (DNC), they shed light on such key figures as Arthur Krim, and they provide intensive coverage of the crucial early stages of the 1968 presidential campaign in fascinating detail. The President's relationships with Hubert Humphrey, Robert F. Kennedy, and Eugene McCarthy come into sharp perspective. The Watson Files will be an indispensable source for students of the rise and decline of the Democratic party in the 1960s.

W. Marvin Watson was born June 6, 1924, in Oakhurst, Texas, where his father ran a small automobile dealership. The young Watson served in the U.S. Marines during World War II, and then earned a B.B.A. in 1949 and an M.A. in 1950 from Baylor University. For the next five years, Watson held several private and governmental posts in Daingerfield, Texas, including a term as county judge. From 1955 to 1965, he was executive assistant to E.B. Germany, president of the Lone Star Steel Company in Dallas. Germany was a very conservative Texas Democrat who had led the rebels—who called themselves the "Texas Regulars"—against Franklin D. Roosevelt in the 1940s. In addition to his employment by Germany, Watson was a member of the Texas State Democratic Committee and an early supporter of Lyndon Johnson's 1960 presidential campaign in Texas. Four years later, the President asked Watson to coordinate the Democratic National Convention in Atlantic City.<sup>2</sup>

Johnson's long-time associate, Walter W. Jenkins, resigned during the 1964 campaign, and Watson became his replacement shortly after Johnson was elected to a full term. As special assistant to the President, Watson had responsibility for presidential appointments and daily scheduling, administrative management of the White House, and liaison work with the Democratic National Committee and other groups affiliated with the party and national politics. Following the departure of Bill Moyers in December 1966, Watson took on more of the role of the White House chief of staff, remaining in that capacity until he was named postmaster general in April 1968.

In his political views, Watson was described as an "authentic, conservative Texas Democrat," but he followed a nonideological course during his White House years. He identified with Lyndon Johnson's desire to keep down the expenses of the operation of the White House and the Democratic party. "I feel that my job is to serve the President," Watson said in 1966. "That doesn't make me a mystery man." Other White House aides found the husky, brown-haired Watson "affable and outgoing," but a stickler for details. One coworker called him "the greatest nit-picker around" who was "the master of the paper clip."

Watson's personal papers for the Johnson years are still not open at the LBJ Library. The records in the Aides Files filmed for this project indicate that Watson acted as a conduit for Lyndon Johnson on political matters. The memos that Watson sent to the President are factual and descriptive, and

contain few hints of Watson's own thoughts. "I am ready to implement your thoughts on the DNC," Watson told Johnson on November 18, 1965. "I need your decisions on the following points." Watson then laid out options for the President's familiar yes/no check-off. A year later, Watson suggested, and Johnson approved, "that Larry O'Brien be requested to take the assignment of coordinating political activities of the Democratic National Committee." Such direct initiatives by Watson, however, are comparatively rare, and the most the researcher can do is to infer Watson's impact on the President from the kind of information that flowed between them.<sup>4</sup>

The largest amount of political information in the Watson Files relates to the 1967–1968 period when Lyndon Johnson was still functioning as an expected candidate for reelection. There is, however, much of interest on the state of the Democratic party in 1965 and 1966. After his victory in 1964, Lyndon Johnson sought to have "the expenditures of the Democratic National Committee be reduced to a realistic monthly average." Johnson emphasized fund raising through the President's Club, reduced the political impact of DNC chairman John Bailey, and relied more heavily on his friend, Arthur Krim. The Watson Files will be an important source for understanding how Krim, president of United Artists, and Johnson handled Democratic party finances. In the process, the question of the degree to which Lyndon Johnson weakened the organizational structure of the Democratic party before 1968 can be appraised.<sup>5</sup>

By the midterm elections of 1966, the Johnson administration and the Great Society faced increasing opposition from Republicans who had rebounded from the Goldwater debacle. Though the White House monitored the House and Senate races closely, there were, as reported by a California congressman in May 1966, "some rather disturbing signs that do not look well for the fall elections," as Republican voter registration increased. The election results bore out the trend as the Republicans made strong gains in the House and picked up several Senate seats in important states such as Illinois and Massachusetts. "Organization, rather than ideology, clearly carried the day for the GOP," the President was told.<sup>6</sup>

The political data that Marvin Watson directed to the Oval Office included an abundance of polls and other less precise measures of the shifting public mood. In September 1967, for example, he sent to his boss a survey of voters in Louisiana disclosing "that the Johnson administration is in trouble, with more than half the voters (55%) disapproving of the way the President is handling his job." Vice President Humphrey's adviser, William Connell, gave Watson an estimate that, with George Wallace in the presidential race, Lyndon Johnson would receive about 321 electoral votes. With Wallace not a candidate, the Republican chances improved markedly and "It looks like a mighty, mighty close election."

Among Watson's tasks was that of keeping a close eye on potential opponents and rivals of Lyndon Johnson. The material in the files reveals how much attention the White House devoted to tracking George Wallace's candidacy as well as the threat that Robert F. Kennedy posed to Johnson's leadership. "I feel George Wallace will be much more of a nuisance and a threat in the north than he will in the South," James Rowe, an old friend and political ally of the President, told Watson in December 1966. It was "not too early," Rowe believed, "to begin thinking about" the strategy if Wallace entered primaries in northern states in 1968.

On Robert F. Kennedy, the Watson Files show the almost obsessive interest of the President and his men in the doings of the New York senator and legatee of the Kennedy tradition. "Start keeping me a file" on Kennedy and Sargent Shriver, Johnson wrote to Watson in December 1966, and White House aides added their comments and prognostications on what Kennedy might be planning. John P. Roche outlined his conclusions on Kennedy's relations with Walter Reuther and the United Auto Workers in February 1967. Weighing his findings and other evidence of Kennedy's public and private statements, Roche concluded that it amounted to "full-court press aimed at discrediting the administration."

Against this perceived threat, the Johnson White House responded in a variety of ways. Watson started files on Democratic contributors to anti-Vietnam dove candidates. In December 1967, Johnson ordered that a Robert Kennedy speech of June 1967 praising the President "ought to go to every National Committeeman and every state chairman" at a time when the senator was considering a presidential race. The irrepressible John Roche "strongly" urged the President to take on both Kennedy and Eugene McCarthy politically. "Get on those ballots, reorganize the DNC, and we will break their backs. Here is one 'Irish dove' who is itching for a fight." <sup>10</sup>

When Eugene McCarthy entered the presidential contest against Johnson in late 1967, the attention of the White House shifted to deal with this new challenge. Watson received a report on the "Conference of Concerned Democrats" that met in Chicago, December 2–3, 1967, to hear McCarthy and work out an anti-Johnson strategy. "The vast majority of the conference delegates were middle-aged liberal Democrats, not young or alienated citizens," concluded one of the Johnson observers in attendance. Watson also sought and received an analysis of "Senator McCarthy's Absenteeism," which outlined the senator's voting record on key bills, presumably for distribution to the party's insiders and the press. By mid-December 1967, Roche wrote to Johnson that "Eugene McCarthy is doing so badly than I am tempted to float a rumor that he is actually working for you to dispirit the 'peace movement.' "11

While the Watson Files contain information on how Lyndon Johnson and his associates regarded their enemies within the party, they are equally revealing on the relationship between the President and Hubert Humphrey. The vice president sent frequent memoranda to Lyndon Johnson about his labors on behalf of the administration and its programs. A substantial number of these documents found their way to Watson's records. In addition, Humphrey's aides kept Watson informed about shifts in the political situation into 1968. A memo from William Connell to the vice president in mid-March 1968 summed up telephone conversations with party leaders. In New York, Connell noted, "This enormous delegation is now in danger of being snapped up by Kennedy," while in Wisconsin "the best estimates are that there will be an enormous Republican crossover. A nearly 100% of doves is expected, and the best we can do is cut our losses by winning heavily in the labor wards." Researchers will find much relevant data here on how Hubert Humphrey responded to the crosscurrents of his political dependence on Lyndon Johnson.<sup>12</sup>

The primary focus of Watson's political work in 1967 and early 1968 was preparing for what almost everyone assumed would be Lyndon Johnson's campaign for another presidential term. The state-by-state organization of more than half the boxes in Watson's files provides a detailed look at the condition of the Democratic party as the election year began. The picture was not an encouraging one for Lyndon Johnson and his colleagues. In Montana, Watson learned from a telephone conversation with the state chairman, "there are those who say 'they just don't like the President'--that many people vote just on the appeal of human beings---there I think Johnson may be in trouble.' "13

One of the most revealing documents that came to Watson was a proposal sent by Lawrence F. O'Brien to the President in September 1967, for reorganizing the Democratic party's structure for the 1968 campaign. Neither the White House political files nor O'Brien himself kept a copy of "A White Paper for the President on the 1968 Presidential Campaign," but the original document and several copies are in the Watson materials. O'Brien's lengthy outline of what the Democrats needed to do—or had already done badly—made for depressing reading. "The Democratic National Committee is not staffed or equipped to conduct a successful presidential election," O'Brien argued, while the Republicans were. "Many of the state organizations are flabby and wedded to techniques which are conventional and outmoded." The DNC needed to modernize, especially in its use of computers. O'Brien predicted that "the Republicans will run a purely emotional and anti-Johnson campaign, which can be tailored to any candidate who happens to get nominated." The problem for his side, as O'Brien viewed it, was that "the Democratic party, to a greater or lesser extent, has lost contact with the voters." O'Brien's "White Paper" offers a penetrating forecast of the long-range problems of the Democrats for the 1970s and beyond.\(^{14}\)

Marvin Watson worked closely with O'Brien, James Rowe, John Criswell of the DNC, and the others who handled the President's cause in the first three months of 1968. Accordingly, Watson retained many of the documents that describe the efforts of party regulars and conservatives to counter the rising pressure of the McCarthy and Kennedy challenges. In the key state of California, the campaign to assemble a pro-Johnson slate of delegates for the June primary involved balancing the interests of Attorney General Thomas Lynch, Speaker of the House Jesse Unruh, Los Angeles mayor Sam Yorty, and former California governor Edmund G. Brown. In October 1967, a California labor leader summed up for Watson the confused state of the Johnson organization as 1968 neared. The White House should "send someone with muscle into the state of California to organize, knock heads, and set up a base." The Watson Files document thoroughly how much difficulty that task presented, and how uncertain the President's chances were in California by the end of March 1968. 15

The midwestern state of Indiana, because of its May primary, drew Watson's attention as well. The state Democratic organization, led by Governor Roger D. Branigin, was irritated about reductions in federal highway funds and miffed because the White House had not sought the governor's advice. Negotiations between Watson and Indiana party chairman Gordon St. Angelo involved what Governor Branigin called "cold fact trading" and further persuasion from Vice President Humphrey before the governor agreed in mid-March to be a stand-in candidate for Lyndon Johnson. 16

Because of their position as early primary states, New Hampshire and Wisconsin were among Marvin Watson's central concerns in 1968, and his files reveal the President's mounting problems against his intraparty opposition. On December 16, 1967, the Democratic state chairman in New Hampshire told Watson "he didn't think there would be too much support for McCarthy in New Hampshire and that the Republicans were not well organized." Three weeks later, John Bailey surveyed the New England states and concluded "that the New Hampshire situation is also serious" with McCarthy in the race and the President following a write-in strategy. The ill-advised use of pledge cards for pro-administration voters was one symbol of Lyndon Johnson's faltering campaign. On March 12, 1968, Eugene McCarthy did much better in New Hampshire than the White House had expected and soon thereafter Robert Kennedy entered the race.<sup>17</sup>

The next major primary was Wisconsin on April 2, and the news for the Johnson candidacy as revealed in the documents that Marvin Watson saw was bleak. "It's just brutal," said one pro-Johnson worker. The McCarthy forces "open a storefront and volunteers just pour in. We open one and we're lucky to get two people." Predictions in the middle of March said that the President would be lucky to receive 50 percent of the vote and from then on matters rapidly fell apart. The state chairman said in a phone call to Watson on March 29 "that they are still working hard but it is an uphill fight. He does not think the President will carry Wisconsin." Before this defeat occurred, Lyndon Johnson made his withdrawal statement on national television on March 31, 1968.

While the memoranda and letters that Watson handled do not bear on the President's decision directly, they do help to establish the context within which the judgment to pull out was made. In early March, a worker for the President in Minnesota explained to Hubert Humphrey why the McCarthy forces had done so well in the delegate fight in that state. "A basic issue at work on the other side in the caucuses, which will be a major issue in our campaign this year—credibility. So many people felt that the President is not telling them the truth." James Rowe put the related problem in equally forthright terms in a memorandum to Lyndon Johnson five days later: "the disenchantment at home with the Vietnam War is, at the moment, more intense than at any time in my experience." The Tet offensive and the events that followed in early 1968 had split the Democrats apart and undermined Johnson's political standing beyond anything that Marvin Watson or other dedicated friends of the President could do to repair it. 19

After Lyndon Johnson withdrew from the presidential contest, Larry O'Brien resigned as postmaster general to become a manager of Robert Kennedy's campaign. The President named Marvin Watson to succeed O'Brien. Making the announcement, Lyndon Johnson said of Watson: "He has been constant in his service and his devotion and he has always been wise and frank in his counsel." The new postmaster general served until the Johnson presidency ended in January 1969. In the years that followed, Watson was active in private business and is now the president of Dallas Baptist College.<sup>20</sup>

The discreet and loyal Watson has, over the years, said little about his days with Lyndon Johnson in the White House. An oral history interview with him is not now available at the LBJ Library, and his private memoranda to the President are still in his unopened private papers. The claims of history about his role as a Johnson aide do not weigh heavily with Marvin Watson. The materials in Watson's files that have been microfilmed reveal more about the state of the Democratic party from 1964 to 1968 than it does about Watson himself. As a resource for the history of the party under Lyndon Johnson's leadership, however, these files are an instructive and valuable guide to the shifting political fortunes of one of the most interesting and important presidents of this century.

## SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

Part II, Series A of the Political Activities of the Johnson White House, consists of the Office Files of Marvin Watson from the Lyndon B. Johnson Library's collection entitled Office Files of the White House Aides. This microfilm publication focuses on the material relating to the political activities of Marvin Watson as special assistant to the President.

The Office Files of the White House Aides consist of material gathered and utilized by the White House aides in their day-to-day operation. These files, kept in the aides' offices and not interfiled into the White House Central Files, contain correspondence between the various White House aides, the President, other cabinet members, and representatives of the various executive departments and agencies, as well as between members of Congress, semi-official organizations, and various White House aides. Memos, analyses, and reports prepared for the use of the White House aides, relate to the issues and problems on which an aide was working.

The Office Files of Marvin Watson reflect his various roles as special assistant to the President. The files utilized in this microfilm publication primarily concern Watson's role as White House liaison with the Democratic National Committee as well as with various state and local political groups. There are also materials relating to Marvin Watson's role as White House chief of staff.

The Office Files of Marvin Watson as found at the LBJ Library consist of six separate series: State Files (1966–1968); Subject Files (1966–1968); Campaign Helpers Files; Chronological Files; Department of Defense Forms; and Office of the Postmaster General Security-Classified Documents. This publication utilizes the State Files (1966–1968) and the Subject Files (1966–1968). The material in these two series has been filmed in its entirety.

#### State Files (1966-1968)

The State Files (1966–1968) consist of various types of political material, including correspondence, reports, analyses, press materials, and polls. This material has been filed by state, territory, and/or region. Most of the individual state files have been further subdivided into one or more categories: General, Senate, Congress, Convention Delegates, Primary, and Governor. Some states have abundant material in one or more of these categories, and these files may be further subdivided by letters of the alphabet. The emphasis of the material in the State Files (1966–1968) is on the 1966 congressional campaigns and elections and the 1968 presidential and congressional campaigns and elections. There is also material on the various gubernatorial, mayoral, and other state and local elections. Topics include: presidential preference primaries; delegate selection for the 1968 Democratic National Convention and analyses of delegate support; evaluations of Democratic party factions and state party organizations; polls surveying public opinions on issues and candidates; and the Vietnam War.

#### Subject Files (1966-1968)

The Subject Files (1966–1968) consist of various types of political material, including correspondence reports, analyses, press materials, polls, and Republican and Democratic party publications. The material in this series has been filed alphabetically by primary subject. The emphasis of the material is on the 1968 presidential and congressional campaigns and elections and, to a lesser extent, on the 1966 congressional campaigns and elections. There is also material on various gubernatorial, mayoral, and other state and local elections. Topics in these files include: the organization and activities of the Democratic National Committee and the Republican National Committee; activities of the Democratic party on a state and national level; various citizens groups, organized and/or reorganized to assist the President in his reelection campaign; and presidential and vice-presidential candidates.

## SUBJECT INDEX

The following is a guide to the major subjects in this collection. The first Arabic number after the entry refers to the reel, and the four-digit number after the colon is the frame number at which a particular subject file begins. Hence 5: 0398 directs the researcher to the subject file that begins at Frame 0398 of Reel 5.

Documents on individuals as found in the State Files are accessed in this subject index by the individual's name, with the appropriate state name as a subhead. Names without state subheads are generally from the Subject File section of the publication. The user is also referred to the Table of Contents for an overview of the material in the state and subject files in this publication.

As in the Reel Index, references in the Subject Index to "the President" are to Lyndon B. Johnson. Also, for the convenience of the researcher, the many subjects treated in the State Files and Subject Files as issues or included in Surveys are listed under those two subjects, as well as individually. More detail is generally found in the specific entry, e.g., Bombing halt issue, Voter attitudes, etc.
