Search Results page has icons accompanying the result that do not have labels conveying what can be done with the content.

Workaround: User can select book and be presented with same options through different path within the book.

Adv Search page has filters which the user can turn on and off. Each on and off button has the same label.

Workaround: Users oriented to the field they are on are presented with the option to turn the selected field on or off in context. Users can orient themselves based on the field label and perform the 'on' and 'off' action next to it.

Bookshelf page has instances of buttons that perform various action but do not have a descriptive name.

Workaround: Selecting a book from the shelf allows users to perform same actions within book.
